Derived from the book Sutasoma by Mpu Tantular, this motto emphasizes the importance of maintaining unity amidst the various ethnic, cultural, religious, and linguistic differences in Indonesia. The concept of Bhinneka Tunggal Ika is reflected in the third principle of Pancasila, namely "Indonesian Unity," which is the foundation for a modern multicultural society. A society that understands and applies the values of Bhinneka Tunggal Ika will be open, equal, and respectful of each other. In the digital era, the influence of globalization and technology can pose challenges to the application of diversity values, especially among children and adolescents. Therefore, Bhinneka Tunggal Ika education since childhood is very important to form wise behavior. The research method used is the literature review method, where researchers examine articles that are relevant to the title and topic of the research that has been determined. According to Arifin, M., & Ekayati, R. (2021) Role-playing is an activity that involves students in situations that resemble real events. In this method, role-playing or simulation is carried out to create a situation that is made similar to the original, but remains under the supervision of the person who created it. According to Rahim, A., & Dwiprabowo, R. (2020) This role-playing method can involve cognitive, affective, and psychomotor aspects, because students can feel and act as various characters, both imaginary and real, in various situations. If planned well, this method can foster a sense of responsibility in working with others and help students learn to make decisions in the context of group work. According to Marlia, S., Fauziana Ridwan, A., & Priatna, A. (2018) The Role Playing method has the advantage of "hidden practice" where students unconsciously use expressions related to the material they are studying. This method is suitable for large classes because it can involve many students. According to Nurgiansah, TH, Hendri, H., & Khoerudin, CM (2021) The role playing method, or role playing, invites students to pretend to be someone with a certain profession, and think and act like that person to understand the profession more deeply. Students can even play the role of law enforcement officers, such as police, prosecutors, judges, lawyers, perpetrators, and victims. In the learning process using the role-playing method, of course, some preparations are needed. The following are the steps that must be prepared in using the role-playing method in the learning process:

1. Theme Explanation

Example Topic: "Differences and Harmony in Everyday Life". The teacher explained that in everyday life, we definitely encounter various differences, differences are not only about religion or ethnicity, differences of opinion between one person and another are also differences and can cause division if not handled properly.

2. Division of Roles.

Students can determine, create, and choose who they want to play.

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- 3. Manuscript Submission
 - Teachers may provide students with a script or short guide for them to practice later.
- 4. Role Play
 - The teacher gives students time to practice dialogue and behavior.
- 5. Implementation of role-playing in front of the class Each group performs role-playing in front of the class.
- 6. Discussion and Reflection

After the activity is completed, the teacher leads a discussion about the students' experiences during the role-playing. The teacher asks what they learned about Bhinneka Tunggal Ika and respecting differences, and provides additional explanations to deepen students' understanding.

4. CONCLUSION

Bhinneka Tunggal Ika, meaning "different but still one," is a motto that reflects the plurality of Indonesian society and is stated in the Pancasila and the 1945 Constitution. This concept is important to understand and implement in national life in order to create harmony despite differences.
