Such students have the potential to engage in social symptoms. Disappointment with family or the surrounding environment continues to affect the behavior of adolescents who deviate to express their feelings (Nor Ba'yah, 2004) a sense of being loved causes individuals to worry about being abandoned and are able to do anything to get affection (Bartholomew and Horowitz, 1991). Students who feel themselves overwhelmed by their love cannot control healthy friendships but are too obsessive, or too following the orders of peers or loved ones so that promiscuity is established (Rubiah, 2001). Failure to deal with relationships as adolescents and early adulthood individuals are trapped in social symptoms such as adultery, pregnancy out of wedlock, birth of children out of wedlock, abortion, and so on. Upholding shame and keeping behavior from becoming the subject of gossip, but now things that are considered taboo seem to be common things to show, for example the phenomenon of dating among students is not a foreign thing to talk about because we can see the phenomenon of dating anywhere, hugging, holding, two-and-two, smoking alcohol we can find among men.

Research Methodology

This study used a qualitative approach by collecting data through interviews with elementary school children, parents, and teachers. Research findings show that promiscuity in elementary school children can occur through various forms, such as the use of social media, friendships outside of school, and interaction with the surrounding environment. Some of the major challenges faced by children in promiscuity include peer pressure, exposure to inappropriate content, and the risk of losing sight in moral and ethical values. They believe that we will be left behind if we do not keep up with the times. (Suhaida, et al 2018) (2) The lack of attention of both parents, Firmansyah, et al. (2020) stated that adolescents who engage in promiscuity because their parents are negligent or broken home. Parental attention is the key to preventing promiscuity with their children, so that children do not easily leave the house which can have a bad influence from their friends. Senaratna et al (2012) argue that adolescents who lack family or guardian support and who grow up in cultures with inadequate alternative value systems are at higher risk of engaging in promiscuity (3) Social media, Suhaida, et al (2018) suggest that media has become a necessity for young people today, because they can access various applications that make it easier for them to see inappropriate content. This is likely to have a negative impact on teenagers, as they tend to abuse social media to access porn sites. Anwar H.K, et al (2019) Teenagers spend a lot of time on social media for bad things, namely finding and accessing vulgar content. Interviews with teenagers revealed that they use the internet to access social media accounts (mostly Instagram, Facebook, and YouTube), do schoolwork, chat via WhatsApp/Line and even access special 18+ pornographic content/movies.

The impact of promiscuity that occurs is that many adolescent boys and girls engage in deviant behavior without thinking about the consequences. They are often indifferent to the negative effects it has on themselves, their families, and the country. This can lead to problems such as drug addiction, contracting sexually transmitted diseases such as HIV, increased crime, and damaged relationships with family. Being pregnant out of wedlock, losing enjoyment in worship, and distancing yourself from the Creator can also have negative consequences. In addition, adolescent boys and girls who are unable to concentrate in school, desperate to study, and have difficulty concentrating often have a negative impact on their academic performance. It is important for parents and schools to play an active role in preventing promiscuity in elementary school children. Some steps that can be done include: (1) Good communication: Parents should establish open communication with their child, listening to their feelings and concerns.
