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STRENGTHENING STUDENTS' CHARACTER THROUGH UNDERSTANDING THE CONCEPT OF BHINNEKA TUNGGAL IKA IN PRIMARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

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Abstract

Education is a learning and teaching process in order to realize 18 good characters in students, namely religious, honest, tolerant, disciplined, hard work, creative, independent, democratic, curious, national spirit, love of the country, respect for achievements, friendly and communicative, love peaceful, likes to read, cares about the environment, social care and responsibility. To be able to realize these 18 characters, education is needed that is based on Pancasila values and the meaning of Bhinneka Tunggal Ika. This research aims to provide information regarding ways that can be done to strengthen student character through understanding the concept of Bhinneka Tunggal Ika among elementary school students. The research method used is the literature review method, where the researcher examines articles that are relevant to the predetermined research title and topic. Based on research conducted using the literature review method, the researchers obtained research results which showed that understanding the concept of Bhinneka Tunggal Ika has great potential to strengthen the character of students in elementary schools, on the basis of tolerance, cooperation and respect for differences. Bhinneka Tunggal Ika can help enrich educational experiences, foster mutual respect and mutual appreciation amidst differences.

Introduction

Character is an important part of a human being that shapes a person's personality and behavior. Character is also often referred to as temperament, character and behavior. According to Supranoto, H. (2015) in Indonesia there are 18 characteristics of the nation's hopes to be applied in everyday life so that they can live in harmony with fellow humans and the surrounding environment. Having a character who can understand and appreciate existing diversity can create harmony in social, national and state life, so it is not surprising why schools in Indonesia not only focus on students' cognitive development but also assess students' character development. This is a hope that students will become individuals who care about existing diversity and have an attitude that embraces differences because the diversity that exists in Indonesia is unique and rich in this country. According to Sari, I. K, (2023) revealed that female students in Indonesia have a diversity of characters, this is due to differences in backgrounds such as ethnicity, religion, culture, interests and abilities. However, according to Anwar, R, (2018), sometimes this diversity creates disputes, such as differences in communication or speaking between individuals, which can lead to differences in perception, giving rise to conflicts in the form of feuds or groupings in the class, which can result in ineffective teaching and learning processes in the classroom. class. According to researchers, this is due to a lack of knowledge of educators in understanding Bhinneka Tunggal Ika and a lack of attention in the form of concern from educators, both parents and teachers, towards students. According to Lestari, R et al., (2023) stated that parents who do not care are the cause of student learning failure. It doesn't matter here, which means that parents who don't support their child's learning process result in the child feeling unmotivated and then looking for a place where he or she will feel appreciated. According to researchers, this is where failure begins to occur when children/students misplace themselves so that there are many cases of crime, both bullying and so on, why does this happen? Clearly

this is caused by a lack of understanding of children/students in understanding and appreciating existing diversity. As we know, diversity is not limited to differences in ethnicity, race and religion but also interests, talents and abilities. This is where the role of Bhinneka Tunggal Ika comes with its meaning, namely:

- a. Unity diversity: With the diversity of tribes, religions, races and cultures in Indonesia, the Indonesian nation remains an inseparable unit. This diversity is recognized, appreciated and united in a spirit of unity.
- b. Tolerance and mutual respect: Respect each other, respect the rights of others and live side by side in harmony amidst differences.
- c. Unity in diversity: Unity and brotherhood which is the shared responsibility of the people of the nation and state.
- d. Cultural riches and uniqueness: All cultural riches in Indonesia are heritage that must be protected and maintained as national identity.

However, the meaning of Bhinneka Tunggal Ika will not be realized in the personality, especially the character of young citizens, if the students/children are not willing to learn to understand and appreciate it. From here the researcher realized that research that examined how to solve the problem of a lack of understanding in understanding and appreciating existing diversity needed to be carried out. Therefore, the aim of this research is to summarize the appropriate way to apply the meaning of Bhinneka Tunggal Ika in the character of *young citizens*.

Research Methodology

Researchers use a literature review research method which uses information sources obtained from the internet in the form of literature reviews in (1). Local, national journals (2). Book. This research method was carried out by examining relevant articles with predetermined research titles and topics. Apart from that, researchers also searched several trusted internet network sources to get vocabulary references.

In this increasingly sophisticated era, the value of unity is vulnerable to fading. This could be caused by many things, but certainly the waning of the value of unity was caused by the nation in that era itself. Why is that? This can happen because of a lack of understanding of what is the basis of nationhood and statehood, a lack of citizen concern for young citizens and a lack of concern for oneself in the form of implementing good character. The lack of understanding which results in an attitude of indifference can be overcome by the role of parents and teachers as educators who teach students through the values of the Pancasila principles and strengthening understanding through the meaning of Bhinneka Tunggal Ika. According to Ainun et al., (2021) the instrumental values of Pancasila have protected society as stated in the articles in the Constitution. One of them is Article 32 paragraph 2 which reads "The State respects and maintains regional languages as national cultural treasures." This is a form of regulation for how unity works, namely by respecting it. As a pluralistic, multi-cultural, multi-religious, multi-racial and multi-lingual nation, we must maintain unity and integrity. According to researchers, the process of understanding through the values of the Pancasila principles is as follows:

- 1. Teaching worship in accordance with the religion/belief held, and not disturbing the worship of adherents of other religions/beliefs (tolerance)
- 2. Teaches to be fair, kind to oneself and fair to others
- 3. Inviting students to give alms, so that their social spirit will emerge in the form of empathy and sympathy
- 4. Teaching an attitude of mutual cooperation, working together and deliberating in every work that must be completed together.

Then Santoso, G, (2023) revealed that efforts that can be made to strengthen students' character through the meaning of Bhineka Tunggal Ika are in the following way:

a. Mutual respect between religions, ethnic groups, appreciating other people's work, working together to build the nation regardless of ethnic, cultural and religious differences, not distinguishing between each other or even insulting each other

- b. A person's personal behavior is required not to see themselves as taking priority over other interests, especially in an organization
- c. Citizens must respect each other's opinions and deliberate to reach a consensus
- d. Respect every other person's religion, by being friendly, tolerant and not differentiating between certain groups or different religions
- e. Respect differences in social strata when interacting and do justice to individuals or groups
- f. Help each other, help citizens affected by disaster
- g. Avoid discrimination that can harm yourself and others in the form of fights, disputes, insults or whatever.
- h. Respect each other's culture, language and customs

This is an effort that can be used to strengthen the good character of the nation's hopes in students as well as increase the understanding of information for educators so that it can be applied to students. Why can this effort strengthen the good character of the nation's hopes in students? It is clear because this effort is an ideal contained in the values contained in the 5 principles of Pancasila, namely divinity, humanity, unity, deliberation and justice. With these efforts, it is hoped that the way students, society and educators think, behave and act will always be oriented towards shared interests and concerns as citizens.

Conclusion

Character is an important part of human personality that shapes a person's behavior. In Indonesia, there are 18 characteristics of national hope which are expected to be applied in everyday life to create harmony in society, nation and state. However, in the midst of the progress of this sophisticated era, the value of unity is vulnerable to fading due to a lack of understanding of the foundations of the nation and state, a lack of understanding is also caused by a lack of concern for others and oneself, so that the implementation of the good character of the nation's hopes has not been fully realized. Lack of support and concern from parents can cause student learning failure, which can ultimately lead to cases of crime. To overcome this, understanding and respecting diversity as reflected in the meaning of Bhinneka Tunggal Ika is very important.
