Some of the obstacles felt when implementing social care attitudes were conveyed by teachers who were homeroom teachers in lower grades, such as in the classroom. Some students are still used to being careless and lazy about sharing with their friends, they think that their belongings are completely theirs, so they will guard these items carefully, namely by not lending out things such as pencils, erasers and sharpeners to other friends because he was afraid that if he lent the item to a friend it would be lost. However, this obstacle is not a big challenge for the class teacher. The teacher will continue to provide examples so that students get used to seeing and imitating these good things.

Conclusion

The implementation of a social care attitude at PAB 5 Klumpang Private Elementary School has been implemented well even though there are existing obstacles. The application of a social caring attitude aims to encourage students' habits and behavior to care for their fellow students and other people, which is done through
