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Abstract

This research aims to find out how important citizenship education is for building national character. Citizenship Education or PKN is education that contains the values of the rights and obligations of citizens so that they become citizens who can think sharply and think critically in life in society and the state. In this research, we explore the importance of citizenship education in building a national spirit for the younger generation in the Millennial era. We analyze the role of citizenship education in shaping civic understanding, attitudes and skills in the younger generation. The research method used in this article is a systematic *literature review*. The word for citizenship in Latin is called Civicus. Subsequently, the word Civicus was absorbed into English to become the word Civic, which means citizens or citizenship. From the word Civic, the words Civic were born, namely civic science, and CivicEducation, namely Citizenship Education. In Indonesia, Civics or citizenship lessons have been known since the Dutch colonial era under the name Burgerkunde. Citizenship Education or PKN is education that contains the values of the rights and obligations of citizens so that they become citizens who can think sharply and think critically in life in society and the state. National defense is a concept formulated by the legislative apparatus and high-ranking officials of a country regarding the patriotism of a person, a group or all components of a country in the interest of maintaining the existence of that country. Defending the country has a meaning that must be understood by the younger generation.

4. Archipelago Insight

The archipelago insight as Indonesian geopolitics, and the values contained in the archipelago insight have been internally integrated into five aspects, namely territorial unity, national unity, economic unity, cultural unity and defense unity.

5. Social Resilience

Social resilience is an integral part of national resilience. Survive at the local system level from the currents of globalization and decentralization. The ability to change threats and challenges into opportunities and opportunities (Mu'man Nuryana, 2002).

6. National Strategy Politics

National politics are the principles, directions, efforts and policies of the State regarding guidance (digestion, development, maintenance and control) and the use of national power to achieve national goals.
